There was this lamentable air in the dim house with its itchy mohair furniture and its dark colors, an awareness—Grandma's— <u>underlaying</u>10 the mentholatum, that her age scared her grandkids. <u>I would during the duti- ful visit yearn</u>11 to get outside into the yard, where Grandma had transplanted a few flowers when she moved from the farm. But even the yard, with its overgrown hedges and rusted metal lawn chairs,12 seemed dreary.
